

Types of Sentences

1. Declarative Sentence: It “declares” or expresses a statement and only ends with a period. “.”

Ex: *She was the first person to get to the store.*



2. Interrogative Sentence: It asks a question or “interrogates” you for an answer and ends in a question mark. “?”

Ex: *What was on sale at the store?*



3. Imperative Sentence: Tells, Commands, or Asks someone to do something. “Imperial” sentences end with periods but can be an exclamation point if there’s strong emotion. “.” “!”

Ex: *Please, be quiet.* (Polite request/command)
Sit down and shut up! (Strong Command)



4. Exclamatory Sentence: It shows strong emotion but is not a command. It ALWAYS ends in an exclamation point. “!”

Ex: *You did great on the test today!* (Happy)
You really hurt my feelings! (Angry)



****Changing punctuation on a sentence DOESN'T ALWAYS change the type of sentence!!****
