5 Basic Comma Rules

Comma: Commas are used to separate parts of a sentence.

1. In a series of two or more items, use a comma after every item except the last one.

Nouns: Brett brought his *helmets, pads,* and *water bottle* to practice.

Verbs: After he caught the ball, Jake *jumped, sprinted,* and *rolled* to make the touchdown.

2. Use a comma between two or more adjectives of equal rank that modify the same noun.

The *cold, wet, slushy* snow made it hard to get to school.

3. **Use a comma before the conjunction that joins two independent clauses of a sentence. (Independent clause = stand alone sentence.)**

Bailey likes to watch television, *but* she would rather play basketball.

4. **Use a comma to set off one or more words that interrupt the flow of thought in a sentence.**

November, *I'd have to say*, is the best month because my birthday is in it and also Thanksgiving!

5. **Use a comma to set off an introductory or middle-of-the-sentence prepositional phrase.**

Of all the holidays, Christmas is my favorite!
