Wednesday Wars Study Guide Questions

- **September**: Holling uses the word “perfect” a lot when describing his house, why do you think he does this? Describe the irony.

Irony: The intended meaning is different/opposite from the actual meaning.

Ex. She’s such a sweet girl. (*She’s really mean*)

Ironic: Situation that is the opposite of what you’d expect.

Ex. Fire station burns down. Police car is stolen.

Wednesday Wars Study Guide Questions

- **October**: What is the conflict between Mr. Hoodhood and his daughter, Heather? (the flower child thing)
- *Why does Heather obey her father and wash it off?*
- **November**: What are Mrs. Baker's thoughts on how *The Tempest* ends? What are your feelings about Mrs. Baker's comments? (pages 70-71)
- *Can people change? Why/Why not?*

Wednesday Wars Study Guide Questions

- **December**: What do Danny Hupfer's actions during the incident at the Baker Sporting Emporium tell you about him?
- *Would a good friend really do that? Would you?*
- **December**: "When gods die, they die hard" (page 93). What god died here? Explain.
- *Has someone you looked up to disappointed you?*

Wednesday Wars Study Guide Questions

- January: Why does Holling disagree with Mrs. Baker about how “malice is a small and petty thing?”

Malice: *Desire/Wish to do something evil/mean.*

- *Has someone ever told you “it’s no big deal” when it really was?*
- January: Explain Holling’s allusion to Macbeth. (pages 128 and 129)

Allusion: *Short reference to something to explain a point or compare the two things.*

MacDuff wants revenge on Macbeth because Macbeth killed his whole family, friends, and servants.
