

Cautionary Tales

Once upon a time doesn't always lead to "happily ever after."



They are tales or stories meant to warn or caution the reader from some kind of behavior.

For example:

A boy was supposed to watch the sheep but he didn't like his job. He thought it was too boring. One day, he decided to play a trick and cried, "WOLF!"



The whole town came running to help him but he just laughed at tricking them.



He did this again the next day. They came and he laughed.

The third day a real wolf came. He cried and screamed but no one came. They didn't believe him. The wolf gobbled up the sheep AND him!



What was this story warning or cautioning about?

Let's try another...

A dog had a wonderful bone in his mouth he'd been looking forward to chewing.



He walked by a river and looked down in the water. He saw another dog there with a bone that looked much bigger than his! What was this?



The dog barked and barked at the other dog but all that happened was he let go of his bone and it fell into the river.



There was no other dog! And he'd just lost his bone!

What was this story warning or cautioning about?

Let's try a last one...

There was a rabbit who was very, very fast. He ran everywhere and showed off his speed.



One day, he saw a turtle and made fun of him for being so slow. He challenged the turtle to a race!



The turtle agreed and all the animals came out to watch.



The rabbit was so sure he'd win that he decided to have a big lunch and take a nap while the turtle started.



But the rabbit had eaten so much he overslept!

When he finally woke up, the turtle was almost to the finish line!



The rabbit ran as fast as he could but it was too late.

The turtle won the race and all the animals never stopped teasing the rabbit for losing to a turtle of all things!
