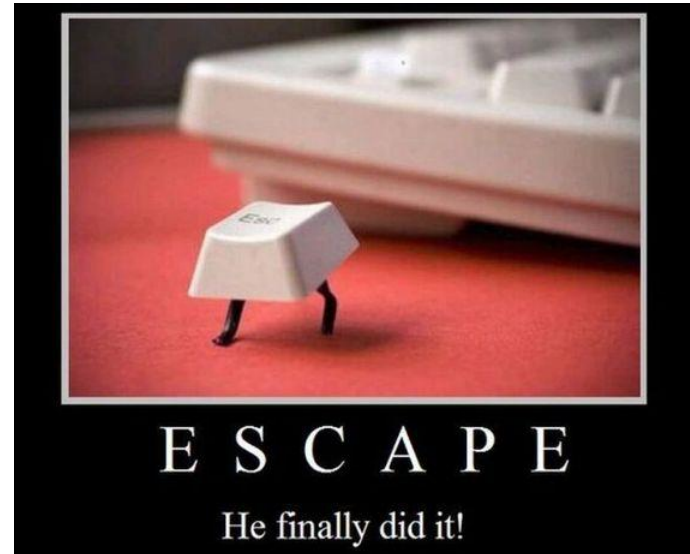

2. FANBOYS - Notes and Assignments

FANBOYS

FOR, AND, NOR, BUT, OR, YET, SO

We start with a Simple Sentence...

A Simple Sentence is a Subject and a Verb.

I like her.

Subject is “I”

The Verb or Action is “like”

We even have an object of our action: “her.”

Then we add a second sentence...

We had: “I like her.”

Let’s add: “She likes me.”

(nice how that relationship-thing works)

Subject is “She”

The Verb or Action is “likes”

We even have an object of our action: “me.”

But I want to combine them!

We had: “I like her.”

And we had: “She likes me.”

Our possible choices?

For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So

Let’s see which one would fit best.

FANBOYS

and

It means = Addition / Next Action

addition -> Tom enjoys playing tennis, **and** he likes cooking.

next action -> We drove home, **and** we went to bed.

FANBOYS

but / yet

Means = Opposition - Unexpected Results

(Opposition) We wanted to visit our friends, **but** we didn't have enough money to get a flight.

(Unexpected) Janet did very well on her job interview, **yet** she didn't get the position.

FANBOYS

for / so

Means = the Cause / the Effect

cause -> Mary needed some new clothing, **so** she went shopping.

effect -> They stayed home for the holiday, **for** they had to work.

FANBOYS

Or

Means = Choice Between Two options

We thought we might go to see a film, **or** we might have dinner out. **(film or dinner?)**

Angela said she might buy him a watch, **or** she might give him a gift certificate. **(watch or gift certificate?)**

FANBOYS

nor

Means = Not this One nor the Other One

We won't be able to visit our friends, **nor** will they be able to visit us this summer. (**can't visit them and they can't visit us**)

Sharon isn't going to the conference, **nor** is she going to present there. (**Not going or presenting**)

FANBOYS

1. **And** – Addition or Next Action
2. **But/Yet** – Opposition or Unexpected Results
3. **For/So** – the Cause or the Effect
4. **Or** – Choice between two options
5. **Nor** – Not this One or the other One

So...I like her. She likes me. Which should I use?

- A. I like her, and she likes me. (She likes me in addition to me liking her)**
- B. I like her, for/so she likes me. (I like her because she likes me, or I like her and the effect of that is she likes me back.)**

Depends on what I want my sentence to say....

FANBOYS

1. **And** – Addition or Next Action
2. **But/Yet** – Opposition or Unexpected Results
3. **For/So** – the Cause or the Effect
4. **Or** – Choice between two options
5. **Nor** – Not this One or the other One

MEANING MATTERS...using And meant something very different from using For or using Or, didn't it?

Make sure you are not changing the meaning by using the wrong conjunction!

FANBOYS

1. **And** – Addition or Next Action
2. **But/Yet** – Opposition or Unexpected Results
3. **For/So** – the Cause or the Effect
4. **Or** – Choice between two options
5. **Nor** – Not this One or the other One

One last thing...THE COMMA!

It always goes BEFORE, BEFORE, BEFORE the conjunction: I like her, and she likes me.

Also...PLEASE use capitalization and periods!

DUH!
