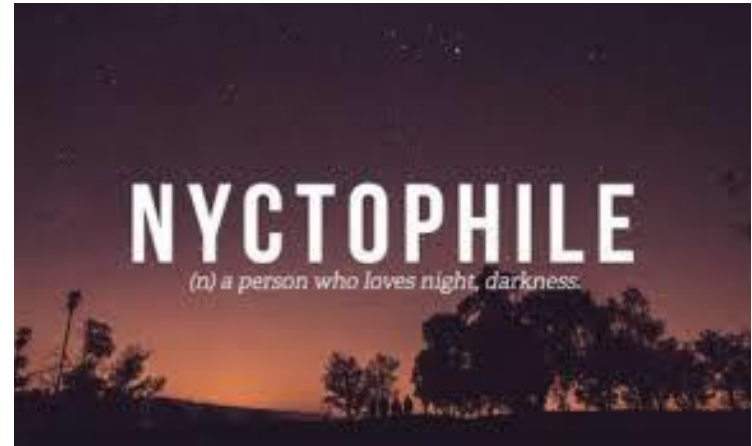

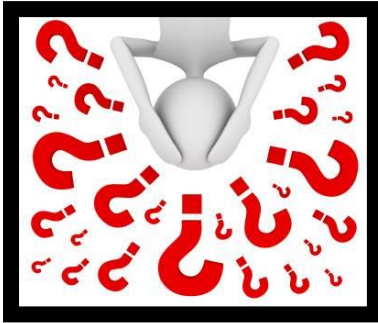

Commonly



lay, lie

Lay – Needs an object to put down

(Lay it on me, Dude!)

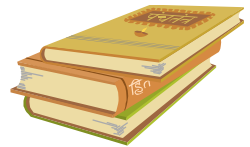


Lie – Doesn't need an object

(I need to lie down.)



Examples: I *lay* the *book* down.



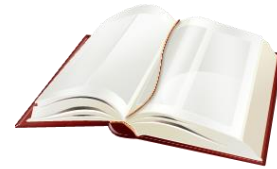
I *lie* down on the bed.



your, you're

Your – Something belongs to you.

(Here's your book.)

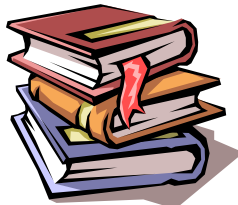


You're – You are

(You're going to get an A.)



Examples: *Your* book is here.



You're getting a book.

Don't know the difference between *your* and *you're*?



Come here and let me slap *your* face until *you're* sure you understand!!

to, too, & two

To – Direction. Go *to* the store.

Too – Also or over the limit.

I'll go to the store, *too*.

That's *too* much work.

Two – Number.

The *two* of us will go.



right, write, & rite

Right – left/right or correct.

Write – Using a pen, pencil or keyboard to make words.



Rite – A ceremony or event.



I was *right* about the test.

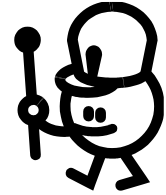
I had to *write* on the test.



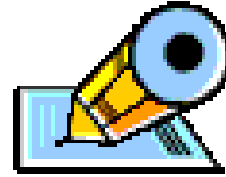
Getting married is a *rite*/ceremony.

led & lead

Led – To guide (past tense).

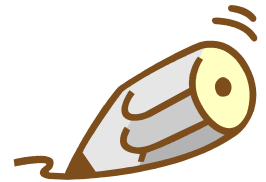


Lead – Metal used in old paint and pencils.



She *led* the parade down the street.

I am out of *lead* for my pencil.
